CONDITIONS

TREBITSCH RESEARCH GRANTS

1. The Trebitsch Award is \$2,200 in funding awarded to the University for consumables.

Projects may be undertaken by students in dentistry at the time of application and will work in a University Department or approved institution under the supervision of members of the academic staff. Applicants may be individuals or a group of students. The successful recipient(s) will be advised in December of each year.

2. The Trebitsch Research Award has been made possible through the generosity of the late Professor F. Trebitsch. The Trebitsch Award is granted for a research project in microbiology, biochemistry, immunology or molecular biology with relevance to clinical dentistry.
3. The project chosen should be of a self-contained and limited nature which can reasonably be expected to be completed in the given time, and should not be part of an on-going project.
4. In considering the application for approval, the Foundation's Research Advisory Committee will take into account the scientific relevance and quality of the application.
5. The abstract will be published in a supplement to the December issue of the *Australian Dental Journal*. The abstract should conform to the customary requirements for papers submitted to the *Australian Dental Journal* (as set out in the ADJ "Guidelines for Authors"). **The abstract shall also conform to the ADRF Abstract Guidelines.**

If a full manuscript is to be submitted for publication in the *Australian Dental Journal*, the author may forward the manuscript directly to the Editor at the same time as the abstract is forwarded to the Foundation. Publication in the *Australian Dental Journal* shall not prevent the author from submitting more detailed or specialised papers to other scientific journals.

In addition to a scientific abstract, the Foundation requests a brief description of 500 'characters' (not words) in lay language also be provided to assist someone with a non-scientific background to be able to understand the research. The lay language summary is intended for publication in broad general purpose outlets such as the *ADA News Bulletin* and will assist the Foundation in disseminating your research findings, while promoting the importance of dental research and the need for ongoing funding.

Leonard Hansen Prize

6. Individuals undertaking the Dental Student, Oral Health Student or Trebitsch research have ***the option*** of submitting a full final report which will be eligible to compete for the Leonard Hansen Prize. This consists of a certificate and a cheque for \$500, provided that the full report has been submitted by the required date of July 31 (students will have up to 18 months to complete the project). The report should be accompanied by certification from the project supervisor(s) that both the research and the report thereof have been truly the work of the individual student, assisted only by oversight, encouragement and advice by the supervisors (note - no other students can be cited on the report, only supervisors).

7. Normal courtesy would require an acknowledgment of the support of the Foundation being made in any publication arising from the work carried out by the holder of a research grant.
